Showmanship

Previous Winners – Previous winner of Senior Showmanship in past years.

Senior Showmanship – Ages 15 years and older as of January 1, 2017 and previous Intermediate Showmanship winners.

Intermediate Showmanship – Age 12 to 14 years old as of January 1, 2017 and previous Junior Showmanship Winners.

Junior Showmanship – Age 9 years old or in third grade during the current year to 11 years old on or before January 1, 2017.

Overall Showman – Winner of Senior, Intermediate and Junior Showmanship classes of this year.

Dairy Goats

1. Dairy Goats must be owned and pre-registered by June 1, 2017.
2. All dairy goats must have Scrapie ID Tag or legible tattoo.
3. All dairy goats must have an official health certificate issued within 30 days of the fair or an Honor Herd certificate issued within the last year.
4. Females only.
5. Goats may have horns but they must be tipped.
6. Dairy Goats will be shown by breed.
7. Recognized breed classes for 2017 fair will be: Alpine, Nigerian Dwarf and Crossbred. Breeds not listed will be entered in the All Other Breeds (AOB) class.
8. Any breed not having two or more entries in the show will be placed in the AOB class.
9. First and second place from each class will return for selection of the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion of their respective breed.
10. Breed Grand and Reserve Champions will return for selection of the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Female of Show.
11. Exhibitor may enter one animal per class per breed.

Class 16. Dairy Goat Female of Show – Winners of Class 12 & 15

Non Dairy Breeding Stock Goats

1. Non dairy goats must be owned and pre-registered by June 1, 2017.
2. All goats must have a Scrapie ID Tag or legible tattoo.
3. Females only from non-dairy breeding stock.
4. All goats must wear a collar.
5. Goats may have horns but they must be tipped
6. All non-dairy breeding goats must have an official health certificate issued within 30 days of the fair or an Honor Herd certificate issued within the last year.
7. Non Dairy Goats will be shown by breed.
8. Recognized breed classes for 2017 fair will be: Boer, Fainting, Pygmy, and Crossbred. Breeds not listed will be entered in the All Other Breeds (AOB) class.
9. Any breed not having two or more entries in the show will be placed in the AOB class.
10. First and second place from each class will return for selection of the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion of their respective breed.
11. Breed Grand and Reserve Champions will return for selection of the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Non Dairy Goat.
12. Exhibitor may enter one animal per class per breed.

Class 23. Sr. Grand and Reserve Champion Non Dairy Goat – Winners of Classes 21-22

Class 24. Non Dairy Goat Female of Show – Winners of Class 20 & 23

Market Goats

1. Market Goats must be owned by April 29, 2017.
2. Market Goats must be checked in on April 29, 2017 from 8 am until 12 noon to be shown and sold at the 2017 fair.
3. All market goats must have a Scrapie ID Tag or legible tattoo.
4. All goats must wear a collar.
5. Goats may have horns but they must be tipped.
6. All goats must be a female or castrated male.
7. Market goats must be born on or after January 1, 2017.
8. Market goats must weigh between 60 lbs and 110 lbs in order to sell at the fair.
9. Market Goats will be shown by divisions with a Grand Champion and Reserve Champion selected for each division: Light Weight, Medium Weight and Heavy Weight.
10. The Grand Champion and Reserve Champion of each division will return for selection of the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Market Goat.

Rate of Gain Contest

1. This contest is open to all participating youth exhibiting market steers, market lambs, market goats and market hogs at the 2017 Berkeley County Youth Fair.
2. Exhibitors must enter the Rate of Gain Contest during online registration of the market animal.
3. Exhibitors may enter two animals per species in the contest but only the animal brought to the 2017 Berkeley County Youth Fair on Saturday, August 5, 2017 will be eligible for awards. All participating animals must be tagged during the scheduled check-in date for the specific species.
4. In order to participate in this contest and establish a beginning weight, all market animals must be tagged and weighed at the designated check-in dates as specified below:
 - Saturday, December 10, 2016 - 9 am – 12 noon - Market Steer Check-in
 - Saturday, April 22, 2017 – 8 am – 12 noon – Market Hog Check-in
 - Saturday, April 29, 2017 – 8 am – 12 noon – Market Lamb Check-in
 - Saturday, April 29, 2017 – 8 am – 12 noon – Market Goat Check-in
5. Ending weight will be taken at the Fair weigh-in on Saturday, August 5, 2017; ending weight for hogs will be Sunday, August 6, 2017.
6. Optional Weigh dates:
 - Wednesday, May 24, 2017 – 6 pm – 8 pm - Optional Weigh-in (10 weeks to fair)
 - Wednesday, June 21, 2017 – 6 pm – 8 pm - Optional Weigh-in (6 weeks to fair)
7. Animals must meet the minimum and maximum weights for the specific species as outlined in the Berkeley County Youth Fair Livestock Rules and Regulations to be eligible for these awards. They must participate in their respective market show during the 2017 Berkeley County Youth Fair.
8. Youth are only eligible for one award per species of livestock. Exhibitors may participate in more than one species.
9. Awards will be presented to the top 3 placing animals per species. Awards will be presented during the 2017 Parade of Champions.
